




JULIEN BROCAL November 22 at 8:30 p.m. Piano

Pianist Julien Brocal presents his new works, created during the pandemic. Born from improvisation, these pieces capture moments of sonic contemplation, inviting inner exploration.

Tracks like "Soul Balm" and "Weightless" encourage us to settle down and enjoy a moment of sonic meditation, far from the distractions of the world.

At the same time I propose an open door to my next album project at Naive, with a first part Haydn – Prokofiev, separated by more than one hundred and fifty years but connected, by humor, love and mood!

JULIEN LIBEER November 23 at 5 p.m. Piano

At the age of four, Julien discovered Leonard Bernstein and Dinu Lipatti, his first great musical inspirations. He received piano training from Jean Fassina and Maria João Pires, with whom he often shared the stage. Artist in residence at Flagey, he performs in prestigious venues around the world and collaborates with renowned orchestras. His prolific discography includes notable recordings, including a Bach Bartok for Harmonia Mundi. Julien is also active in educational projects, such as "Singing Molenbeek" and conferences at the University of Louvain.

THE GREAT MOZART November 24 at 11 a.m. Ismaël Margain, piano Luigia Messina, Conteuse

- "- It's normal that you can't do everything like your brother, he's Mozart.


FANNY AZZURO November 24 at 1:30 p.m. Piano

Fanny Azzuro, a pianist from a family of Italian musicians, explores soundscapes imbued with light in her new album on the Naïve label. She performs two cycles of *Preludes*: Chopin's Opus 28 and Scriabin's Opus 11, both organized in a circle of fifths. Scriabin draws inspiration from Chopin while introducing the expressive audacities that mark his early works. Azzuro adopts a subtle and light approach, revealing the balance and emotional intensity of these 19th-century masterpieces.

NATHANAEL GOUIN November 24 at 3:30 p.m. Piano

Nathanaël Gouin, a French pianist hailed for his "immense talent" (L'Humanité), is recognized for the inventiveness of his sounds and the nobility of his interpretations. His album "Bizet sans Paroles" (2020) was awarded a Diapason d'or, confirming his status as an exceptional musician. He performs as a soloist with prestigious orchestras and collaborates with artists such as Renaud Capuçon and Augustin Dumay. Professor at the École Normale de Paris in 2024, he continues to enrich his career with compositions for piano, voice and orchestra.

PIERRE SOLOT November 24 at 5:30 p.m. Piano

Pianist Pierre Solot explores the mixed music of Ernesto Lecuona, combining romantic virtuosity, Cuban dances and 19th-century Viennese influences. A Cuban composer (1895-1963), Lecuona was admired by Gershwin and Ravel during his tours. Heir to the great pianists of the 19th century, he transformed the piano into a machine-orchestra capable of evoking dance as well as solitude and romantic exile. Solot breathes new life into this fiery and passionate musical wealth.

JEAN-BAPTISTE DOULCET November 24 at 7:30 p.m. Piano

Jean-Baptiste Doulcet, a winner of prestigious competitions such as the Concours Marguerite Long, is a rising star of French piano, according to Classica. He has played in venues such as the Salle Pleyel and performed at festivals such as La Roque d'Anthéron. In 2024, he will make his debut at the BBC Proms. His album Un monde fantastique has been acclaimed, and his next, Søleils Blancs, explores Nordic music. A well-rounded musician, he excels in chamber music and composes works for various ensembles.

THE EXHIBITION

ISABELLE DECLÈVE "Living on the street"

In Declève's gouaches, what we are looking at is not the inhabitant of the street whom we could not or dared not look at, but this reshaped being who, through the colors, materials and lights that emerged from the intimate confrontation between the artist and his subject, forces us to see him. No longer living at our feet on the sidewalks that we tread, but facing us, in a lighting, even a dazzling light that exposes him to us, if not in a restored dignity, at least in the strength of a rediscovered existence. Still living in the street, but also, now, our gaze.



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In the heart of Brussels, a former 16th-century fishmonger's shop has been reborn, transformed into a vast, friendly lounge. Inhabited and decorated with recycled materials, this space invites you to enjoy concerts in a warm and intimate atmosphere, just like at home.

THE ORIGIN



The Jardin Musical workshop

Founded in 2019 by pianist Julien Brocal, a former student of Maria João Pires, the Jardin Musical is an initiative aimed at recreating a craft cultural industry, focused on creativity, sharing and conviviality. Located in a 16th-century building on Place Sainte-Catherine, in the historic heart of Brussels, this multidisciplinary space hosts music, painting, literature, cinema and dance, with music as its central focus.

Le Jardin Musical offers an intimate lounge for 50 people and a space that can accommodate up to 200 people. Events are recorded and broadcast on Youtube, allowing for wide digital distribution. Le Jardin also produces recordings for its own label, and collaborates with institutions such as RTBF, France 2 and Cyprès, while offering support to young artists through the accompaniment of professional projects.

In the midst of the pandemic crisis, the Jardin Musical was able to create permanent employment and support 150 artists, reaching nearly 4 million listeners around the world via its digital channels.
